Nod y Cynllun

Er mwyn gwireddu amcanion yr ysgolion uchod o ddarparu addysg Gymraeg o'r radd flaenaf, yn seiliedig ar gontinwwm dysgu rhwng 3 ac 16 oed, anelwn at sicrhau bod disgyblion y clwstwr yn elwa drwy'r gweithdrefnau trosglwyddo a gynigir er mwyn iddynt ymgartrefu'n rhwydd yn yr ysgol gyfun gan ymateb yn llawn i'r profiadau addysgol a chymdeithasol newydd. Golyga hyn fod y cynllun yn hyrwyddo dilyniant a pharhad o ran y cwricwlwm newydd a hefyd yn y gofal bugeiliol a roddir i'r disgyblion gan hyrwyddo'r ffordd tuag at gynnydd academiaidd.

Hanfod y cynllun yw nodi sut yr ydym yn cydweithio i gyflawni'r nodau uchod. Yn unol â'r canllawiau a roddwyd, bydd y cynllun yn cael ei adolygu yn flynyddol.

Mae'r Cynllun yn nodi'r camau a gymerir yn unol â'r gofynion craidd isod a ddarparwyd gan Lywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru o dan Gofyniad i Lunio Cynlluniau Pontio a Chanllawiau 2022:

- Sut byddwn fel clwstwr yn cydgysylltu ac yn rheoli'r broses bontio o'r ysgolion cynradd sy'n bwydo i'r ysgolion uwchradd i ddysgwyr
- Sut byddwn fel clwstwr yn sicrhau parhad dysgu yn gyffredinol drwy gynllunio'r cwricwlwm a chynllunio ar gyfer dysgu ac addysgu i ddysgwyr ym Mlwyddyn 6 sy'n pontio i Flwyddyn 7
- Sut y caiff cynnydd dysgwyr eu gefnogi wrth bontio o'r ysgol gynradd i'r ysgol uwchradd
- Sut y caiff anghenion dysgu a lles pob dysgwr unigol eu cefnogi wrth iddyn nhw bontio o'r ysgol gynradd i'r ysgol uwchradd
- Byddwn fel clwstwr yn adolygu ac yn monitro effaith y cynllun pontio o ran sut mae wedi helpu i:
 - sicrhau parhad dysgu
 - cefnogi cynnydd dysgwyr unigol

Yn ogystal â'r gofynion craidd uchod noda'r cynllun sut y byddwn yn cydweithio i sicrhau bod trefniadau effeithiol ar gyfer trosglwyddo yn y meysydd canlynol:

- Cysylltiadau bugeiliol i fodloni anghenion personol a chymdeithasol y disgyblion
- Rhannu gwybodaeth am gyflawniadau a chyrhaeddiad disgyblion
- Rhoi gwybod am anghenion dysgu disgyblion unigol

- Cydweithio wrth gynllunio'r cwricwlwm i sicrhau continwwm dysgu a ddisgrifir yn genedlaethol ar gyfer dysgwyr rhwng 3 ac 16 oed.

Ym mhob achos, noda'r cynllun y gwaith cyfredol a pharhaus parthed trosglwyddo o flwyddyn 6 i 7 gan barhau drwy'r camau cynnydd Cwricwlwm i Gymru. Os nodir meysydd i'w datblygu ymhellach byddwn yn cytuno ar flaenoriaethau blynyddol ac yn gweithio arnynt gyda'n gilydd yn ystod cyfnod y cynllun.

Rheoli a chydgysylltu'r broses drosglwyddo

Bydd Brifathrawon yr holl ysgolion a Phennaeth Cynorthwyol Rhydywaun yn cyfarfod yn rheolaidd, fan leiaf unwaith bob tymor. Bydd aelodau'r grŵp yn gwneud adolygiad blynyddol o'r cynllun trosglwyddo ar ddechrau y flwyddyn ysgol, gan ystyried y cynnydd a wnaed a chytuno ar flaenoriaethau'r flwyddyn. Bydd angen i gyrff llywodraethu'r ysgolion gytuno ar yr argymhellion sy'n deillio o'r adolygiad.

Bydd y clwstwr yn penodi cadeirydd ar gyfer y flwyddyn academiaidd ac yn pennu blaenoriaethau ar gyfer cydweithio a datblygu. Mae'r blaenoriaethau y cytunwyd arnynt ar gyfer blwyddyn academiaidd 2024-25 fel a ganlyn:

1. Cwricwlwm - Ffocws ar y meysydd leithoedd a Dyniaethau
2. Llythrennedd - Ffocws ar ddatblygu strategaethau cyson i wella Llythrennedd
3. Data - Parhau i ymchwilio i gasglu data cytûn ar draws y clwstwr.

O fewn Corff Llywodraethol pob ysgol bydd cynrychiolydd o'r Grŵp Llywio yn rhoi adborth rheolaidd i'r Corff ar y datblygiadau trosglwyddo diweddaraf.

Mae llywodraethwyr enwebiedig ar gyfer trosglwyddo ar gyrff llywodraethol pob un o'r ysgolion.

Cyd-gysylltydd Trosglwyddo

Penodwyd Mr Arwel James yn Gyd-gysylltydd Trosglwyddo, ac fe fydd yn hyrwyddo gwaith y grŵp llywio, ac yn benodol yn cynghori ar:

- Fonitro'r cynnydd ar y prif feysydd i'w gwella sydd wedi eu nodi yn y cynllun
- Y dull gorau o sicrhau fod cyfleoedd rheolaidd i gynnwys rhieni/gofalwyr a disgyblion wrth gael adborth a chynllunio
- Sut i sicrhau bod cysylltiadau effeithiol â'r gwaith sy'n digwydd dan arweiniad yr awdurdod lleol
- Unrhyw gamau i fodloni'r gofynion sydd wedi eu nodi yng nghanllawiau Llywodraeth y Cynulliad mewn cysylltiad ag adolygu a chyhoeddi'r Cynllun Trosglwyddo.

Mr Arwel James a Mrs Heidi Bryant-Miles, Cydlynnydd ADY, fydd yn gyfrifol am gasglu gwybodaeth am y disgyblion a rheadru'r wybodaeth honno.

2. Sicrhau dilyniant mewn dulliau dysgu ac addysgu

Credwn fod sicrhau dilyniant mewn dysgu ac addysgu yn holl bwysig wrth hyrwyddo trosglwyddo effeithiol rhwng y cyfnodau allweddol. Gwerthfawrogi'r gwaith a wneir parthed technegau dysgu ac addysgu gan holl ysgolion y bartneriaeth. Cydweithir rhwng yr ysgolion ar y dulliau hyn, ac ar yr un pryd, rhoddir cyfle i ehangu ar ddarpariaeth arbenigol gwahanol aelodau o'r staff.

Yn gyfredol hyrwyddir parhad mewn dulliau dysgu ac addysgu drwy'r gweithgareddau canlynol:

1. Rhoddir cyfle i athrawon Blwyddyn 6 ymweld â gwersi ac arsylwi arddulliau addysgu a dysgu ar gyfer Blwyddyn 7, gan roi cyfle iddynt raeadru eu canfyddiadau i staff y sector cynradd.
2. Rhoddir cyfle i staff uwchradd ymweld ag ysgolion cynradd i arsylwi gwersi, trafod dilyniant a rhannu arfer dda.
3. Rhoddir y cyfle i flynyddoedd chwech y partneriaid cynradd ddod i Rydywaun er mwyn cael rhagflas o wersi yn yr uwchradd. Croesewir athrawon i'r gwersi hyn er mwyn arsylwi arnynt a rhoi'r cyfle iddynt drafod unrhyw fater perthnasol a allai godi.
4. Mae ysgolion y bartneriaeth yn fwy na bodlon rhannu offer gyda'i gilydd er mwyn hyrwyddo parhad yn y dulliau dysgu ac addysgu e.e. offer gwyddoniaeth/TGCh.
5. HMS clwstwr cyfan le arddangosir strategaethau dysgu ac addysgu megis Dysgu i'r Brig, Llais Rhydywaun/Llais 21, cynllun 'Dim ond Darllen' a meddylfryd Twf. Bydd y model HMS clwstwr yn parhau i ddatblygu yn y flwyddyn academaidd 2024-25 gyda strategaethau cytûn i'w gyflwyno ym mhob ysgol gynradd.
6. Datblygwyd ymagwedd gyson at ymddygiad a safonau i annog agwedd gadarnhaol at ddysgu. Defnyddir adnoddau cyson ar draws y clwstwr fel posteri ethos a safonau cymunedol.

Gwneir defnydd helaeth o wybodaeth flaenorol am y disgyblion pan gychwynnant ym Mlwyddyn 7 yn Rhydywaun. Bydd y wybodaeth yn cael ei defnyddio er mwyn pennu targedau wrth i'r disgyblion dilyn llwybrau dysgu ar hyd y camau cynnydd. Mae cywirdeb y wybodaeth hyn yn hanfodol ac amlinellir y wybodaeth gyfredol a dderbynnir isod, ynghyd â'r meysydd i'w datblygu.

1. Bydd cydlynwyr Maes Dysgu a Phrofiad yn cyfarfod yn rheolaidd i drafod cynnwys y cwricwlwm ac i feincnodi cerrig milltir hollbwysig wrth ddysgu pob cam cynnydd. Edrychir ar lyfrau a cheir cyfle i drafod gyda disgyblion yn unigol ac mewn grwpiau.

Trafodir unrhyw enghreifftiau o dangyflawni neu o gynnydd sylweddol gydag athrawon yn Rhydywaun.

3. Bydd athrawon Rhydywaun yn ymweld â'r ysgolion cynradd yn aml drwy gydol y flwyddyn academiaidd i gyflwyno ystod o wersi, gan gyfoethogi cydweithio a dilyniant cwricwlaidd.
4. Cynhelir anwythiad deuddydd ym mis Gorffennaf sy'n rhoi cyfle i ddisgyblion gwrdd â'u dosbarthiadau a'u tiwtoriaid newydd, yn ogystal â phrofi diwrnod ysgol arferol yn Rhydywaun.
5. Cynhelir cyfarfodydd ar gyfer rhieni yn rhithiol ac ar safle'r ysgol.
6. Cynhelir cystadlaethau chwaraeon megis cystadleuaeth rygbi/pêl-rwyd a mabolgampau clwstwr.

6. Rhoi gwybod am anghenion dysgu disgyblion unigol

Yn unol ag ym mhwynt 2 uchod, ceir yr ymweliadau isod er mwyn sicrhau bod yr ysgol uwchradd yn derbyn y wybodaeth angenrheidiol ac yn gallu cynllunio ar gyfer diwallu anghenion y disgyblion hyn. Rhaeadrir y wybodaeth berthnasol i staff gan y Cydlynnydd ADY ac mae'r wybodaeth hefyd ar gael ar i staff Rhydywaun, lle yn perthnasol.

Yr ymweliadau ar hyn o bryd ydyw:

1. Ceir ymweliadau gan aelodau Hafan Rhydywaun er mwyn adnabod disgyblion sydd ag anghenion addysgiadol a chydweithio gyda'r staff cynradd er mwyn penderfynu ar y dulliau gorau o ddiwallu'r anghenion hynny.

Aim of the Cluster Transition Plan

As a cluster, we have a shared vision to provide first class Welsh medium education, based on an effective continuum of learning between the ages of 3 and 16. The aim of this transition plan is to ensure that all pupils in our cluster benefit fully from the range of transition activities, initiatives and support strategies offered so that students integrate swiftly and successfully into Ysgol Gyfun Gymraeg Rhydywaun, responding fully to the new educational and social experiences this significant milestone represents. This plan, promotes progression and continuity in the new curriculum and supports the pastoral care given to pupils across the cluster, continuing the high standards laid in foundation at primary level towards academic and lifelong progress.

This plan identifies how we collaborate to achieve the above goals. In accordance with the guidelines given, the plan will be reviewed annually.

The plan sets out the steps to be taken in accordance with the core requirements below provided by the Welsh Assembly Government under the Transition Regulations 2022:

- How we as a cluster coordinate and manage the transition process for learners from primary to secondary education.
- How we as a cluster collaborate to ensure continuation in learning through effective curriculum management for learners transitioning from year 6 to year 7.
- How learner progress can be supported during transition from primary to secondary education.
- How additional learning and welfare needs can be supported as learners transition from primary to secondary education.
- As a cluster, we will review and in monitor the effectiveness of the transition plan in terms of how effectively the plan:
 - ensures continuation of learning
 - supports the progress of individual learners

In addition to the core requirements above, the plan states how we will work together to ensure that there are effective arrangements for Transition in the following areas:

- Pastoral links to satisfy the pupils' personal and social needs
- Sharing of information regarding pupils' achievements and attainment
- Sharing information about the learning needs of individual pupils
- Collaborate when planning the curriculum to ensure a learning continuum for learners between 3 and 16 years of age.

In all cases, the plan notes the current and ongoing work regarding the transition from year 6 to 7, as learners progress through the Curriculum for Wales progress stages. If areas for further development are identified we will agree to collaborate in addressing these areas of development annually.

Managing and coordinating the Transition process

The Headteachers of all primary schools and the Assistant Headteacher of Ysgol Gyfun Gymraeg Rhydywaun, with responsibility over transition, will meet at least once every term. This group will annually review the Transition plan at the beginning of the academic year,

taking into account the progress made in the previous academic year, and agreeing on priorities for the year ahead. The Governing Bodies of the schools will agree on the recommendations resulting from the review.

The cluster will appoint a chair for the academic year and assign priorities for collaboration and development. The agreed priorities for the academic year 2024-25 are as follows:

1. Curriculum - Specific focus on Languages and Humanities
2. Literacy - Focus on developing consistent strategies to improve literacy
3. Data - Develop strategy to standardise data across the cluster.

Within each school's Governing Body a representative will give regular feedback to the Body on the latest Transition developments. There are nominated governors for Transition on the governing bodies of each of the schools.

Transition Coordinator

Mr Arwel James has been appointed as Transition Coordinator at Ysgol Gyfun Gymraeg Rhydywaun, and will form and promote the work of a transition steering group, and specifically advise on:

- Progress on the main areas for improvement that have been identified in the plan
- The best way to ensure that there are regular opportunities to involve parents/carers and pupils in getting feedback and planning
- How to ensure that there are effective links with the work that takes place under the guidance of the local authority
- Any steps to meet the requirements set out in the Assembly Government's guidelines in connection with the review and publication of the Transition Plan.

Mr Arwel James will work closely with the Year 7 Head of Progress and Welfare, Mrs Hefina Morgan, and the Additional Learning Needs Coordinator, Mrs Heidi Bryant-Miles. Mr Arwel James is responsible for the Transition arrangements, including organising meetings and activities, primary school visits, and transferring information about Ysgol Gyfun Gymraeg Rhydywaun.

The Head of Progress and Welfare will work with Mr Arwel James from June onwards. Mr Arwel James and Mrs Heidi Bryant-Miles, ALN Coordinator, will be responsible for collecting information about the pupils and distributing this as required to relevant staff.

1. Planning the curriculum together

The cluster's Transition policy states that we provide opportunities for members of Ysgol Gyfun Gymraeg Rhydywaun's Areas of Learning and Experience to meet with teachers from the primary schools in order to promote collaboration and subject knowledge across the progression steps.

Curricular collaboration is currently implemented by:

- Areas of learning and experience in joint planning, aligning teaching and learning methods and sharing good practice

- Sharing examples of departmental resources and examples of lessons on the Yr.6 Rhydywaun website
- Subject based transition visits to promote good practice in subjects such as Geography, Music, Technology, Information Technology, Art and Drama, Food Technology, History, and Spanish
- Standardisation of assessment through moderation meetings across subjects
- Standardisation of assessment practices and systems across the cluster
- Holding joint INSET sessions

2. Ensure continuity in teaching and learning methods

We believe that ensuring continuity in teaching and learning is critical in promoting effective Transition between the key stages. The work completed in relation to teaching and learning techniques by all schools in the partnership is greatly appreciated. There is successful collaboration between the schools on varied methods, with opportunities provided to expand on the specialist provision of different members of the staff at all schools.

Continuity in teaching and learning methods are currently promoted through the following activities:

1. Year 6 teachers are given the opportunity to visit lessons and observe teaching and learning styles for Year 7, giving them the opportunity to cascade their findings to primary sector staff.
2. Secondary staff are given the opportunity to visit Primary schools to observe lessons, discuss continuity and share good practice.
3. Opportunity is given for year six to attend lesson taster sessions at Ysgol Gyfun Gymraeg Rhydywaun to gain experience across the range of the curriculum. Year 6 teachers are welcome to attend the lessons with opportunity provided following the lessons to discuss and provide feedback on the experience.
4. Cluster schools are willing to share equipment in order to promote continuity in teaching and learning methods e.g. Science/ICT equipment.
5. Whole cluster INSET where teaching and learning strategies are demonstrated such as Teach to the Top, Voice 21, the 'Just Reading' scheme and Growth mindset. The

cluster INSET model will continue to develop in the 2024-25 academic year with agreed strategies to be introduced across primary schools.

6. Consistent approach to behavior and standards to encourage a positive attitude for learning Consistent resources are used across the cluster such as ethos and community standards posters.

3. Ensure consistency in assessing, monitoring and following the pupil's progress/attainment

Extensive use is made historical attainment data when pupils transition from Primary to Secondary school. The information will be used to determine targets as the pupils follow learning paths along the progression steps. The accuracy of this information is essential and will be collected during numerous meetings between primary and secondary staff throughout the academic year. Areas of development are detailed below:

1. AoLE coordinators will meet regularly to discuss curriculum content and benchmark 'non-negotiables' as critical milestones in learning a each progression step.
2. An opportunity is given annually to AoLE coordinators to monitor and assess pupils' work in Year 7. Books are examined with opportunity to discuss with pupils individually and in groups. Any examples of significant progress or underachievement are discussed with teachers in Rhydywaun.
3. Members of the Hafan (ALN / Welfare department) will visit the primary schools in order to identify pupils with educational / welfare needs and decide on the best methods of meeting those needs.
4. Rhydywaun will receive information about formal assessments across the curriculum from the primary schools, together with the results of Literacy and Numeracy Tests.
5. There will be joint meetings in order to plan assessment within the with the aim of ensuring consistency. The cluster will continue to explore assessment opportunities throughout the 2024-25 academic year.
6. Standardised assessment models are under development across the cluster benchmarking pupil progress against identified success criteria utilising a range of assessment models both formative and summative.

4. Pastoral arrangements to fulfill the pupils' personal and social needs

A successful pastoral transition is essential in ensuring the continued development of students as they progress through their education into the secondary phase. A full pastoral transition program has been established, and the program is evaluated annually by Year 7

pupils, parents, Year 6 teachers and the Cluster Headteachers. Amendments are made annually following recommendations raised during the evaluation process. Current transition arrangements include the following:

1. There is an open evening so that parents and year 6 pupils can visit the school site.
2. The Assistant Headteacher (AEJ), as well as other key staff, will visit the pupils in Year 6 on more than one occasion before the transition, introducing the school to the pupils. The visits throughout the academic year, will include a visit by the Year 7 Head of Progress and Welfare in order to distribute a wide range of information, including information about the induction days and the induction course in Llangrannog.
3. Rhydywaun teachers will visit the primary schools frequently throughout the academic year to deliver a range of lessons, enriching curriculum collaboration and progression.
4. A two-day induction is held in July which gives pupils the opportunity to meet their new classes and tutors, as well as experiencing a typical school day at Rhydywaun.
5. Meetings for parents are held virtually and on the school site.
6. Sports competitions are held such as a rugby / netball competition and a cluster sports day.
7. During the third week of the term a residential course is held at the Llangrannog Urdd Camp.
8. Aspects of Transition are discussed School Senedd and year forum meetings. Recommendations are put into practice where possible.
9. Members of the Sixth Form are used as mentors during the visiting days, and as pastoral support in Llangrannog, in the class, and on the reading plan for the target group. The mentors are available to listen to Year 7 pupils' concerns and offer them support. Some Sixth Form pupils are trained by Bullies Out.

5. Sharing information about pupils' achievements and attainment which complements the statutory information

It is essential that the secondary school receives wide ranging information about pupils in year 6 in order to obtain as complete a profile of each pupil as possible. Current information is collected by Mr Arwel James, Mrs Heidi Bryant-Miles and Mrs Hefina Morgan, Head of Progress and Welfare for Year 7, during visits to the primary schools. The teachers of the

cluster schools have a good understanding of Rhydywaun's organisation regarding the grouping of Year 7 pupils. The cluster schools will use the Provision Maps software to record and share relevant information.

1. Shared information will contain:

- Pupil attainment
- Relevant family background such as brothers/sisters, parental responsibilities, home language
- Children in the care of the authority or families in need of support
- Behavior
- Effort and motivation
- Interests
- Significant achievements outside of school
- Extracurricular information such as sports and music
- Important information regarding medical needs

The ALN Coordinator and Head of Progress and Welfare will collate the information, and with the assistance of other relevant school staff, disseminate necessary information to the relevant staff at Rhydywaun. Any confidential information received will remain confidential and only shared with staff if necessary.

2. In collaboration with the Primary school staff, Rhydywaun's ALN Coordinator will evaluate the information collected, including that of a pupils' backgrounds and decide on a support plan if necessary. The information is shared with the Head of Progress and any other relevant member of staff.

3. The School Nurse will meet with relevant staff at Rhydywaun to discuss pupils with medical needs.

6. Establishing the learning needs of individual pupils

In accordance with point 2 above, the visits below are made to ensure that the secondary school receives the necessary information and is able to plan to meet the needs of pupils. The relevant information is disseminated to staff by the ALN Coordinator and the information is also made available to Rhydywaun staff, where relevant.

Current visits include:

1. Visits by Rhydywaun's Hafan staff members (ALN and SEBD department) in order to identify pupils with educational or social/emotional needs and to work together with the primary staff in order to decide on the best methods of meeting those needs.
2. Other visits will take place based on discussions with cluster schools during the academic year and in response to identified needs.
3. Students with ALN/SEBD needs will be given an additional opportunity to visit Rhydywaun. These students will be identified by the primary schools.
